The day of Pentecost is a Spiritual jubilee (Spiritual redemption). The OT jubilee years were a physical jubilee (physical redemption). The other difference between the two is: *weeks* v.s. *years*.

PENTECOST - Spiritual Freedom

When determining the day of Pentecost, the count begins one day after the seventh day Sabbath. (Ref: article titled: "[When Do We Begin the Count Unto Pentecost?](#)") Seven weeks are to be counted, equaling 49 days. (7 weeks x 7 days in a week = 49 days) Then, 1 day is added that totals 50 days. Thus, Pentecost is always observed on the first day of the week. (Ref: Lev 23:15-16) (Additional refs: Acts 1:8, 2:1-4)

OT JUBILEE - Physical Freedom

There were seven Sabbatical rest years within a physical jubilee period. (7 years x 7 sabbatical years = 49 total years). During the 49th year, on the day of Atonement, the jubilee is proclaimed as the following year. Therefore, the following year totals 50 years. (Ref: Lev 25)
